What is Project Sunrise?

Project Sunrise is Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) initiative funded by the Victorian African Communities Action Plan (VACAP). This project is led by the African Australian Welfare Bureau together with Odyssey House Victoria, Positive Wellness Recovery Centre (PWRC) and Youth Support and Advocacy Service (YSAS).



- Intersectional case management
- Flexibility between counseling and care coordination
- Advocacy to other services

Supporting the Family

- Educating the family around AOD and recovery
- Teaching and facilitating effective communication between the family and young person
- Helping family to set effective limits and consequences
- Navigating cultural issues and intergenerational conflict
- Supporting family members with self-care
- Working and advocating with support services
