- Identifies critical service gaps and pressures
- Facilitates strategies to improve responsiveness to people with AOD issues, population diversity and broader community need.

- data access
- role marketing and communication; engagement with DHHS

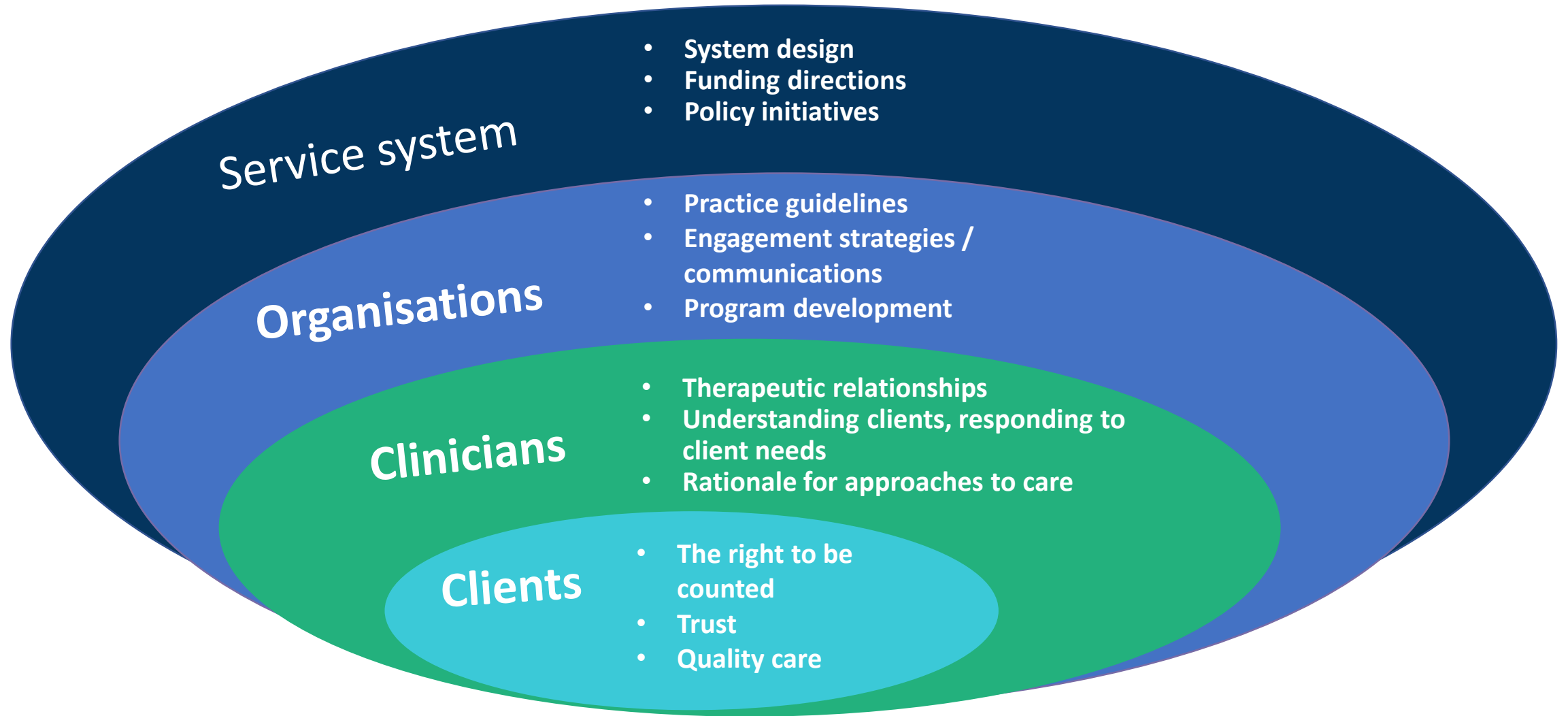

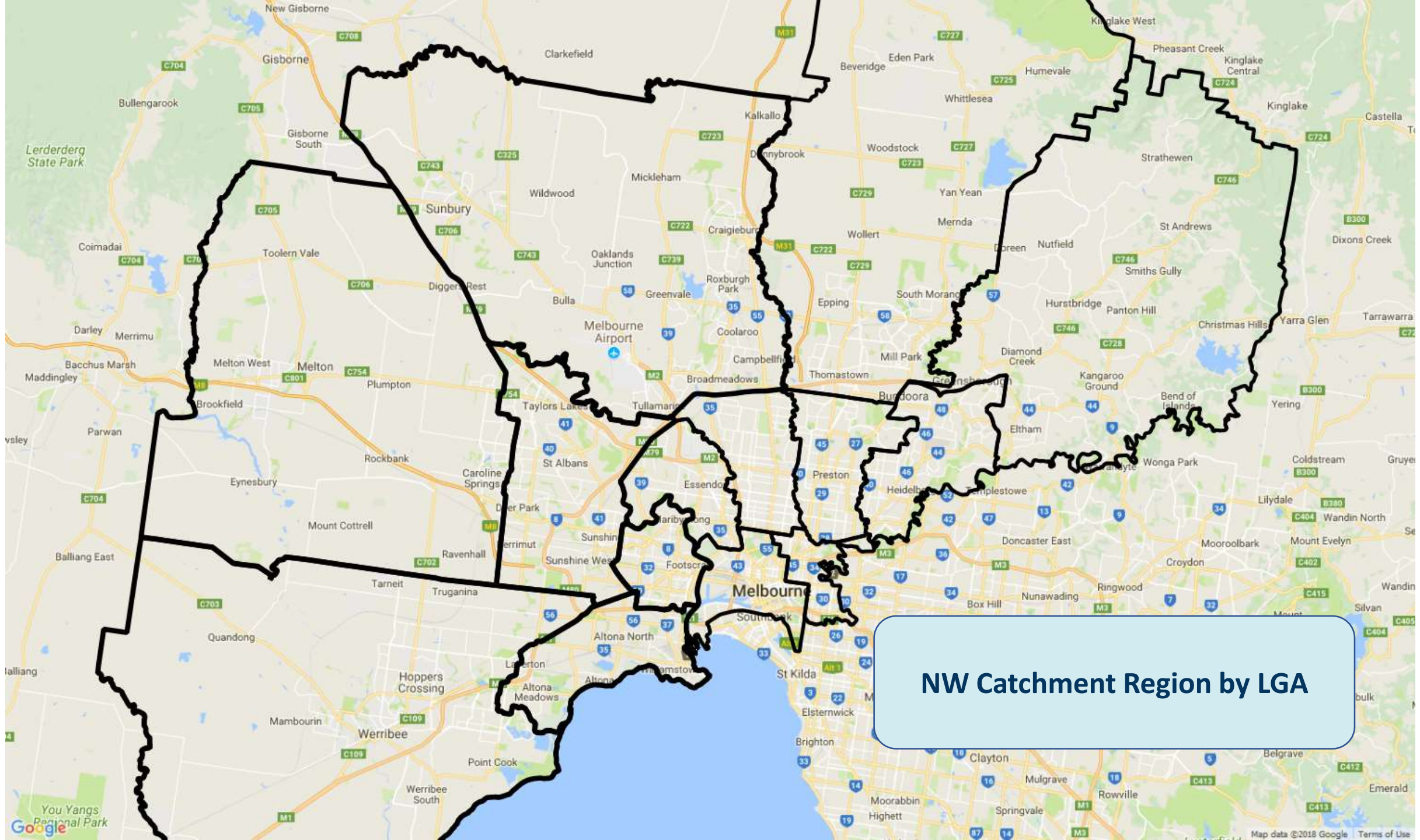


Culturally and
