Statewide demographics

Over 30,800 clients in 2016-17



Most clients are between 20-39 years of age



Split between living in metro Melbourne (51%) and regional Victoria (47%)



Mostly male (68%)




7% Indigenous

Harms from AOD have been increasing in Victoria

AOD related ambulance attendances

Deaths from drug overdose are increasing




This represents over 40k ambulance attendances and over 500 deaths per year

Evidence shows client needs are more than just AOD

- High co-morbidities
- Challenging proportion of clients in unstable housing
- Very few AOD clients in hospitals are referred to specialist AOD services
- Clients misusing pharmaceuticals are underrepresented, indicating potential lack of support across a range of health settings
