# Women's Day Rehabilitation Program

- Women's only six week treatment facility
- Gender specific facility which focuses on women's issues – anecdotal evidence
- FV and AOD issues
- Motivation for developing group



# FV Psychoeducation Group

- Developed group from evidence based contemporary resources (CRAF, DV Alert)
- Structure of group
  - ❖ Introduction
  - ❖ 8 categories
  - ❖ Cycle of violence
  - ❖ Myths and facts
  - ❖ High risk factors
  - ❖ Impacts on children
  - ❖ Early warning signs



# FV & AOD Research Project

- Research to date –literature review focusing on FV interventions for women within AOD settings.
- Themes identified from Australian and international research
  - ❖ Main finding/theme is the relationship between FV and AOD issues
    - Statistics
    - Increases risk/and severity of abuse
    - Increasing AOD use as coping mechanism
  - ❖ Barriers to accessing FV treatment when experiencing AOD issues and vice versa
  - ❖ Gender specific treatment
  - ❖ Current FV interventions for clients already engaging with AOD support
  - ❖ Issues with service collaboration
  - ❖ Lack of staff training and confidence to address both issues co-occurring
- Future plans to have the group formally evaluated
- Gaps in the literature
